RESOLUTION AMENDING THE FEBRUARY 7, 2022 CITY OF CONOVER AND SHERRILL FURNITURE COMPANY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, on February 7, 2022, the City of Conover approved a Joint Economic Development Agreement with Sherrill Furniture Company (the “Agreement”);

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, Conover agreed to make certain economic incentive payments to Sherrill Furniture Company over the course of three (3) grant years, contingent upon Sherrill Furniture Company satisfying the job creation and other requirements set forth in the Agreement;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Paragraph 6(b) of the Agreement, the maximum payments to be made by the City to Sherrill Furniture Company are as follows:

Payment Period	Total Number of New Jobs Paying Above \$43,290 by Year	Maximum Payment By City by Year
Grant Year 1 (2023)	11	\$11,000
Grant Year 2 (2024)	26	\$26,000
Grant Year 3 (2025)	4	\$4,000
Total	41	\$41,000

WHEREAS, in 2023, Sherrill Furniture Company received from the City the maximum payment for Grant Year 1 in the amount of \$11,000.00;

WHEREAS, Sherrill Furniture Company has provided the City with information evidencing that it has satisfied all requirements of the Agreement and that it is entitled to the maximum remaining sum under the Agreement for Grant Year 2 and Grant Year 3, a total of \$30,000.00;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, the maximum incentive payment by the City for Grant Year 2 in the amount of \$26,000.00 is now due and owing, but the maximum incentive payment for Grant Year 3 in the amount of \$4,000.00 would not be payable until 2025;

WHEREAS, for administrative purposes and to minimize further costs to the City related to this Agreement, the City Council desires that the Agreement be amended to allow the maximum payment for Grant Years 2 and 3 to be paid to Sherrill Furniture Company following approval of this Resolution and the related budget ordinance, and that the administration of the Agreement be closed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Conover,

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North Carolina:

1. *The Joint Economic Development Agreement with Sherrill Furniture Company dated February 7, 2022 is hereby amended to allow the maximum incentive payment of Grant Year 2 and Grant Year 3, in the total sum of \$30,000.00, to be paid to Sherrill Furniture Company following approval of this Resolution and the related budget ordinance.*

2. *The Mayor of the City of Conover or his designee is authorized to execute the necessary documents in order to close the administration of the Agreement.*

CITY OF CONOVER RESOLUTION 08-24

RESOLUTION FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF MINIMAL AND OVERPAYMENT OF AD VALOREM TAXES

WHEREAS, the administrative costs associated with collecting and refunding minimal ad valorem taxes exceeds the value of the taxes owed or refunded; and

WHEREAS, NCGS § 105-321(f) authorizes a local government to adopt a resolution directing the Tax Assessor and Tax Collector not to collect minimal taxes, which are defined as the combined taxes and fees due on a tax receipt that do not exceed \$5.00, charged on the tax records; and

WHEREAS, NCGS § 105-321(f) further provides the Tax Administrator shall not bill for, or otherwise collect, minimal taxes but shall keep a record of all minimal taxes by receipt number and amount and make a report of the amount of these taxes to the governing body at the time of settlement; and

Whereas, NCGS § 105-321(g) authorizes a local government to adopt a resolution directing its Tax Administrator not to mail a refund of an overpayment if the refund is less than \$15.00; and

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WHEREAS, NCGS § 105-321(g) further provides that upon adoption of a resolution authorizing the Tax Administrator not to make a refund of an overpayment if the refund is less than \$15.00, the Tax Collector shall make a report of the amount of these refunds to the City of Conover Council; implement a system by which payment of the refund may be made to a taxpayer who comes into the office of the Tax Collector seeking the refund; and as to refunds that are not requested in person by the end of the fiscal year, implement a system to apply the minimal refund as a credit against the tax liability of the taxpayer for ad valorem taxes due for the next succeeding year; and

WHEREAS, NCGS §§ 105-321 (f) and (g) do not apply to taxes on registered motor vehicles; and

WHEREAS, NCGS § 105-357(c) permits the Tax Collector to treat small underpayments of taxes as fully paid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

(1) Pursuant to NCGS § 105-321(f), the City of Conover Council directs the Catawba County Tax Administrator and Tax Collector not to collect minimal taxes, which are the combined taxes and fees due on a tax receipt that do not exceed \$5.00, charged on the tax records. The Tax Administrator must implement the processes required by NCGS § 105-321(f).

(2) Pursuant to NCGS § 105-321(g), the City of Conover Council authorizes the Catawba County Tax Administrator not to mail a refund of any overpayment if the refund is less than \$15.00. The Tax Administrator must implement processes required by NCGS § 105-321(g).

(3) Pursuant to NCGS § 105-357(c) the City of Conover Council permits the Catawba County Tax Collector to treat small underpayments of taxes as fully paid. A "small underpayment" is a payment made, other than in person, that is no more than one dollar (\$1.00) less than the taxes due on a tax receipt.

(4) This Resolution shall remain in effect until repealed or amended by resolution of the City of Conover Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be in effect with respect to Fiscal Year 2024-2025 and shall remain in effect until amended or repealed by resolution of the City of Conover Council.

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Eric Williams, Assistant Public Utilities Director presented Resolution 09-24: Resolution to Apply for CWSRF Loan for Lecho Park Outfall Replacement. There have been 13 SSOs in ten years. Estimated cost to replace the line is \$4.1 million. The City would like to apply for a State Revolving Fund Loan. This will also open up potential grant opportunities in the future. If approved, McGill Associates would charge \$7,000 to assist the city. There was some discussion about the current placement of the line and its future location. There was some discussion about reaching out to the state legislature for assistance. Potentially, easements would need to be obtained for this project.

WHEREAS, The City of Conover has need for and intends to construct a project described as Lecho Park Outfall Sewer Replacement Project, and

WHEREAS, The City of Conover intends to request State loan and/or grant assistance for the project,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONOVER:

*That the City of Conover, the **Applicant**, will arrange financing for all remaining costs of the project, if approved for a State loan and/or grant award.*

*That the **Applicant** will provide for efficient operation and maintenance of the project on completion of construction thereof.*

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schedule of fees and charges and other available funds which will provide adequate funds for proper operation, maintenance, and administration of the system and the repayment of all principal and interest on the debt.

*That the governing body of the **Applicant** agrees to include in the loan agreement a provision authorizing the State Treasurer, upon failure of the City of Conover to make a scheduled repayment of the loan, to withhold from the City of Conover any State funds that would otherwise be distributed to the local government unit in an amount sufficient to pay all sums then due and payable to the State as a repayment of the loan.*

*That **Mr. Tom Hart, Conover City Manager**, the **Authorized Representative**, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the **Applicant** with the State of North Carolina for a loan and/or grant to aid in the study of or construction of the project described above.*

*That **Mr. Tom Hart, Conover City Manager**, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the appropriate State agency may request in connection with such application or the project: to make the assurances as contained above; and to execute such other documents as may be required in connection with the application.*

*That the **Applicant** has substantially complied or will substantially comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, and funding conditions applicable to the project and to Federal and State grants and loans pertaining thereto.*

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN UPDATE

WHEREAS, The City of Conover has a current Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund that spans 10-years, and

WHEREAS, The City of Conover held a City Council Meeting on April 1st, 2024, to present the 10-Year Water and Sewer CIP with some project costs updated by McGill Associates to reflect current construction market, and

WHEREAS, An application for funding submitted to the North Carolina Department of Environment Quality (DEQ) Division of Water Infrastructure (DWI) may earn points if the Applicant has a CIP adopted by the City Council within two years of the application date.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CONOVER:

That City of Conover does hereby adopt the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) as updated for the Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget, as presented at the April 1st, 2024, City Council Meeting.

Item 12: Resolution 11-24: Resolution Authorizing Application for Accessible Parks Grant

Kurt L. Beal, Finance Director presented Resolution 11-24: Resolution Authorizing Application for Accessible Parks Grant. The grant is for up to \$500,000 in state funds, and it is administered through NC Parks PARTF program. It is to provide updates and enhancements to a park to maximize recreational opportunities for people with disabilities. There is a twenty percent match required. The city should hear results back by August 23rd. The city will have three years to complete the project. If approved for the grant, the city is not obligated to accept and this matter would be brought before Council again.

City Manager Hart stated that City Park would not be eligible for this grant. The City has studied Downtown Park and Majestic Park attendance data. Both will be further reviewed to see which will line up best with this grant opportunity. Even without the grant, plans are to work toward updating both parks. Possible updates under this grant could include ADA pathways from parking area to the parking, ADA-compatible bathrooms, better play services, and better play equipment.

AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR ACCESSIBLE PARKS GRANT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FACILITIES AND ADAPTION OF EXISTING FACILITIES

WHEREAS, The Accessible Parks Grant Program provides funds in matching grants for parks and recreation for people with disabilities for the construction of special facilities or adaption of existing facilities to enable them to participate in recreational and sporting activities, regardless of the abilities, and

WHEREAS, The program is administered through the N.C. Division of Parks and Recreation and the N.C. Parks and Recreation Trust Fund and requires at least one dollar of local funds for every five dollars in grant funds, and

WHEREAS, The City of Conover has need for and intends to make improvements and upgrades to our current park to meet the unique needs of people with disabilities to maximize opportunities for recreation, and

WHEREAS, The City of Conover intends to request state grant assistance for the project,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONOVER:

That the City of Conover, the Applicant, will meet the required one dollar of matching funds for five dollars of grant funds within three years of submitting the application.

That the Applicant will provide for efficient operation and maintenance of the project on completion of system implementation thereof.

That Tom Hart, City Manager, the Authorized Official, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized to execute and file an application that is true and correct on behalf of the Applicant with the State of North Carolina for a grant to aid in the planning of the project as described above.

That the Authorized Official, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the appropriate State agency may request in connection with such application or the project: to make the assurances as contained above; and to execute such other documents as may be required in connection with the application.

That the Applicant has substantially complied with all Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances applicable to the project and to Federal and State grants and loans pertaining thereto.
